- Robin Pilkey, appointed by the City of Toronto, serves as Chair of our Audit and Finance Committee.

Together, we are proud stewards of an organization with an incredible legacy — one that, for more than 114 years, has helped shape the identity, infrastructure, and vitality of Toronto and its waterfront.

Corporately, we advanced our work in fostering a "one-waterfront" community — bringing together diverse stakeholders to reimagine and invest in Toronto's spectacular waterfront as a vibrant, inclusive, and dynamic place to live, work, and visit.

Just as the Toronto Harbour Commission helped shape the city's future in 1911, we too have the opportunity — here in 2025 — to make history once again.
