



DECKHAND ENGINEER, RELIEF

The Deckhand Engineer, Relief participates in the daily operation of the PortsToronto ferries providing access to and from Billy Bishop Airport. The Relief Deckhand Engineer facilitates the loading and unloading of ferry passengers, reporting any operational issues to the Captain and the general upkeep of the vessel.

The Deckhand Engineer, Relief demonstrates professionalism and dedication to ensure a safe and efficient ferry service and a positive customer experience.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

General activities and functions include, but are not limited to:

- Handling the public in a tactful and courteous manner.
- The safe and efficient operation of docking, vehicle stowage, and passenger control.
- Assisting in the operation and checking of the engines on PortsToronto's ferries.
- Maintaining the ferries in a clean and tidy manner paying particular attention to proper housekeeping conditions.

- Reporting all equipment malfunctions, and/or incidents involving passengers, to the Captain as quickly as possible.
- Maintaining daily and weekly checklists as assigned.
- Must comply with all PortsToronto policies and procedures including Health and Safety policies, SOPs, procedures, and legislated requirements, as well as being familiar with the regulations of the Ship Safety Branch of Transport Canada.
- Must wear designated safety equipment/PPE as required.
- Adhere to all PortsToronto policies.
- Other duties as assigned by PortsToronto.

ABILITIES:

- Must be mechanically inclined with the ability to maintain and run diesel engines, pumps, compressors, etc. on the ferries.
- Clear oral and written English communication skills ensuring accuracy, understanding, and execution of work instructions
- Display effective interpersonal relationships tact, good judgment and reliability required
- Must have physical ability and strength, with emphasis on eyesight, hearing, and nerves.
- Able to lift up to 25 Kgs (50 Lbs) floor to waist
- Able to swim or tread water for a minimum of two minutes

CERTIFICATES AND LICENSCES REQUIRED:

- Possess and maintain an up-to-date SeaFarer's Medical Certificate.
- Possess and maintain an up-to-date certificate of Marine Emergency Duties Level "D" training.
- Possess and maintain an up-to-date Temporary Engineer's Certificate, or the ability to acquire within 2 months.
- Possess and maintain an up-to-date Continued Proficiency Certificate.
- Possess a valid Marine Basic or Advanced First Aid Certificate, or the ability to acquire within one month.

HOURS OF WORK: This role works 7 ½ hour days, 5 days per week on a relief basis between the hours of 5:00am and 12:30am, including weekends and holidays. Overnight work possible depending on weather conditions.

COMPENSATION: \$39.24/hour
